Another month with no BMC rally activity in the near future. Our Picnic Rally was held in early October and went well. Willis put a great event together with really nice scenic roads in northern Delaware.

Upcoming in the area is the well known Pine Barrens Express (PBX) event in new Jersey. If you want a unique driving experience this is a must. PBX roads are sand trails and change almost daily with sometimes not sometimes significant puddles in the dips. Speeds are probably in the high 20s to low 30s mostly, but are a real challenge, particularly in the portion running after dark. If you don't care to read about my own recent exploits you can stop here. Otherwise, take note of the past weekend of Oct. 22,23,24 when the annual United States Road Rally Challenge (USRRC) was held in Emmitsburg, MD. The USRRC consists of a GTA (untimed trap event based on answers to questions), a regular Course/Trap event, & a Tour Rally (a Monte Carlo). The very best and elite competitors make up a large portion of the entry which numbered about 20 to 25 cars (similar to our March Lamb entry field). My partner and I did better than usual this year, finishing 2nd in our Equipped Class for the weekend. We were about 12th on the GTA event but were quite competitive on the Monte Carlo with a 2nd and the Trap Rally with another 2nd. It was exhausting weekend after three all-day events; leaving about 7:30 am and finishing about 5:30 pm.

So that's it for this month and we settle in for the BMC Christmas Party and (for myself) planning for the March Lamb XV.
