Rally Notes - Dave Teter

PBX - ok, yeh, I almost forgot. The Pine Barrens Express (PBX) rally was a smashing success. It had 45 entries running a daylight section beginning at 2 PM, followed by a dinner break, then a night section. There were 10 controls in each section, occurring about 9 minutes apart on average. The average speed was about 25 mph, which was moderately demanding (especially at night) on the narrow sand tracks with occasional deeper sand and puddles.

My regular SCCA rally partner came from Virginia to team with me in running a checkpoint in each section. There were at least 20 checkpoint workers plus a ham radio person at each control. There were 2 people in the lead car and 3 in the sweep car, plus 2 more hams, plus 6 people at HQ receiving timing info for scoring by radio or cell phone. Close to 45 workers – all put together by the South Jersey Region committee and made it a gigantic success.

Just thinking that those who like autocrossing might have enjoyed this event. You can get sideways in sand even at 25 mph. It was NOT a car breaker, but a good car wash would be required afterward.

Mark the date – Our SCCA/BMC March Lamb XIV Rally date is now set for March 26 2011.
