## Two County Rally Wrapup by Wayne Elvin, "Car 0"

This cooperative effort with the British Car Club of Delaware was held on Sunday afternoon May 15th. George Alderman and a host of BMC members combined to design and execute a rally course for first time TSD rallyists in southern Chester County and northern New Castle County, and provide workers for the checkpoints, registration, start & scoring.

There were 11 cars (out of 14 pre-registered) to run this TSD rally, which was the first-ever timed event for the majority of the BCCD entrants. The afternoon was a little gray at the start, but skies quickly cleared with a very pleasant afternoon and more than one snappy convertible enjoying top down weather. There was no rain detected until the first cars arrived at The Hunter's Den for the finish results and trophy.

George made excellent use of the Braille rally course from two weeks previous by upping the average speed to 26 MPH, and slightly modifying the course to loop back into open Checkpoint # 1 for a 2nd checkpoint, with the third open checkpoint back on Faulkland Road near the start at Brandywine Springs Park. In addition, there were a total of five timed passage controls. Two near the afternoon rest break at the Park Office for White Clay Creek Park, two in Landenberg, and one on Barley Mill Road. The mix of interesting and pleasant back roads were perfect for an easy rally tour. Willis Weldin took on the task of scoring all eight controls with a spreadsheet on his laptop for the contestants, and posted the results shortly after all the cars had arrived.

Running pre-sweep, I was appalled to find the second largest sign missing on the rally route. Only "Hartefeld" was larger, but the roof sign for "The Landenberg Store" disappeared shortly before rally day, apparently for some repairs. This clue was used twice at that intersection, requiring posting emergency signs twice. There was very liberal use of mileages at almost every instruction, as well as many elapsed times at points along the course. Checkpoints of the open type were noted in the instructions with an opportunity for low scores. The timed passage controls were not obvious, with two on the second timed leg and three on the third timed leg.

It is a testament to George's rally design and careful instructions with all eleven cars making every checkpoint! Some early, some late, and some low scores, but only 1 zero. There were 22 competitors, with at least 15 workers and individuals who contributed to this successful event. #### Rally Wrap Up

The BCCD and BMC "Two County Rally" on May 15<sup>th</sup> started at 1 PM and ended about 4 PM at The Hunters' Den restaurant. The open Checkpoints were noted on the route instructions, and the elapsed times were given in the route instructions about a half-mile before each Checkpoint. The secret to a good score, however, was to arrive on time at the unknown locations of the five Passage Controls.

Don Butler, car #1 (a BMC member who ran rallies many years ago) driving a Lotus Elan with teenage son Brandon navigating, was both early and late at various checkpoints and passage controls. Our newest BMC member, Rick Kauffman, navigated and his dad Richard drove Rick's Miata and finished with the best score of all with under 3.5 minutes total error for 3 checkpoints and 5 passage controls. Mark and Michele Schroy (members of both BMC and BCCD) drove the family Ford Explorer to the second best score and First in the Experienced Class. The Schroys were the only team to get a 0 score on a Checkpoint or Passage Control. Sharon Kalinowski (BCCD Secretary) driving her Mercury Montego (instead of her TR3) with navigator Paul Mizzatesta and Sharon's granddaughter were 8th to start and first to finish. They must have been anxious to sample the food and beverages at The Hunters' Den!

I think everyone enjoyed driving the course, and the highlight of the event was the great looking trophies designed by Natalie Gimbel combining both clubs'emblems (shown at top of this page) into unique awards. *George Alderman, Rally Chair* 

#### Braille Rally 2011 - What A Blast! -- By Scott Clabaugh

On Sunday, May 1<sup>st</sup>, they came from far and wide to attend the 41st Running of the Braille Rally, and it's now in the history books as another great Brandywine Motorsport Club event. Again, working with the Porsche Club of America – Delaware Region, smiling faces were quite abundant all afternoon as our clubs put on a great afternoon of fun for the Delaware Association for the Blind (DAB). This was an eventful year, and I've got a lot to write about!

WHAT IS A BRAILLE RALLY? - The Braille Rally combines a visually impaired navigator reading the driving directions in Braille to the driver. It's up to the driver to follow those directions and stay on course *and* on time!

OFF WE GO - After gathering at Brandywine Springs Park, the navigators were paired up with their drivers for the day and a brief instructional meeting was held. The first car departed to run the Rally course promptly at 2:01 and 16 more cars were off at one-minute intervals.

Drivers needed a lot of discipline to make a successful attempt at winning this year's rally. BMC Rallymaster George Alderman selected an average course speed of just 24 MPH, and if you wanted to be on time at the checkpoints, you had to average only 24 MPH. Two checkpoints on the course made things a little easier on the driver, BUT this year, there were Passage Control checkpoints, too. Just when you thought it was ok to speed up and then stop and rest for a while, you get zapped!

BACK AT LANDIS LODGE - It took about two hours to cover the course and everyone made it safely back to the Landis Lodge. While we had a short delay waiting for the pizza to arrive, all participants had a great time socializing with their navigators, talking about what went right (or wrong!) and also with the other drivers. It was a great time for the visually impaired to catch up with each other, too.

WHO WON? - First place went to the team of navigator Patricia Scarcelli and driver Vince Suddard. Their total time amounted to being just 80 off of the course time. This was the first time driving in the Braille Rally for Vince - Congrats!

Second place went to the team of navigator Joan Abbott and driver Scott Wootten. Their total time amounted to just 132 off of the course time. Scott is a new PCA member attending his first PCA meeting in April. Welcome Scott!

Third place went to the team of navigator Sylvia Reid and driver Bob Bloser. Their total time amounted to just 257 off of the course time. Sylvia and Bob finished 12<sup>th</sup> last year, so that's a great improvement!

WHAT DID THEY WIN? – All drivers and navigators received a Braille Rally T-Shirt and all navigators received a participation trophy, which this year was a winged steering wheel on a marble base. The wings on the steering wheel were actually checkered flags.

First, Second, and Third Place navigators and drivers received a larger trophy, with the navigators also receiving a \$75/\$50/\$25Visa Gift Card. And we can't forget about Last Place, which got an award, too! Named after our Braille Rally founder, "The Renee O'Leary Best Chance of Improvement for the next Braille Rally", gets you a \$25 Visa Gift Card. This award is named for Renee as she started this rally back in the early 70's while recovering from throat cancer.

Porsche of Delaware generously supports this event each year donating T-Shirts to all navigators, drivers and course workers. They've been doing this since the PCA became

involved in this event back in 2002 and we thank them very much for their continued support.

DRIVERS - All but one driver was a PCA member. We even had one PCA member from Ohio who saw the article about the Braille Rally on the PCA Web page and wanted to participate. Ohio PCA member David Owen called me a couple weeks ago and said that he'd like to run in the rally as it sounded like a lot of fun. He rearranged his visit to Delaware to coincide with other activities he had planned here. Thanks David for driving in the event. Come back anytime!

In addition to David and the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place drivers, the other PCA members that participated were Anthony Guzzo, David Morrell, Bill Cooper, Debbie Cooper, Bob Bloser, Nick Dunlop, Vince Crognale, Bruce Grassano, Jon Walton, Danelle Haag, Sam Dali, Aaron Turner, and Adam Vogelsong. Steve and Derek Cohen ran "sweep car" to pick up any strays along the way. Also, DAB member Bev Weiland navigated for her husband Bruce Chemesky and her guide dog in their family van. A BIG THANKS to all the drivers! Well done!

HAPPY AND SAD NEWS - Happy News- Linda Lauria, Executive Director of the DAB retired in March after over 25 years of service to the blind community. She was in attendance and we commemorated her retirement on the front of the T-Shirt saying "Happy Retirement – Linda Lauria" right below the main "41st Annual Braille Rally" title. Happy Retirement, Linda! Also on hand was newly appointed Executive Director, Ellen Spoehr, who joined us for her first Braille Rally! Welcome Ellen!

Sad News – Navigator Pat Cassidy, who competed in ALL 40 Braille Rallies, passed away in August 2010. I asked each participant to remember Pat while we were out on the course.
