Autocross Report

Our August autocross started out well; it was a nice summer day with 37 drivers participating. We had a number of first time autocrossers present that hopefully will be hooked and join us for future events.

While the day started well, as the event progressed dark clouds started moving in. By mid-day, the rain started and it got pretty heavy. While doing autocross in the rain can be fun for the drivers, with the limited amount of run-off room at the school and complaints from wet course workers, we decided to end the event early. Unfortunately, most drivers only got 2 runs. This was disappointing, but looking back over the last 4 years of events, this is the only event where we got rained on. Not too bad when you look at it that way.

Paul Alderman was able to get FTD, but had to resort to a Caterham R500 lightweight to do it. The intermittent problems with the car had been solved and it looked very strong. He had a pretty good margin over 2nd fastest Duke Wilford, but I believe if we had more runs it would have been closer.

Congratulations to Porsche drivers Will Pyle, Larry Waltemire, and Scott Wootten for winning C stock, B stock, and A stock. In fact, the only class a Porsche was in that a Porsche driver didn't win was the class I was in! Maybe I should drive my other car next time so I won't embarrass the marque.

Our last event of the 2011 season is scheduled for Sunday, October 16 in Dover. BMC will be awarding the Lofland Memorial Trophy for fastest time of the day. This event is part of PCA Reisentoter Region's autocross series, so we expect several Porsche drivers from RTR to participate. Let's have a good turnout and give them some competition!
