Just another story – hardly rally related, but occurring while doing some 'rally' work. My March Lamb XVI instructions are in pencil draft form, but would they work? I launched about 10 A.M. to measure mileage

and check instruction accuracy. Instructions worked fairly well (with multiple changes), but about 1/2 hr into the 4 hr trek I noticed 'Gee - this clutch pedal feels funny!' Another $\frac{1}{2}$ hour and the pedal would not return to full retract as I had to stick my toe under the pedal and pop it back up. This continued for awhile as I could discern as I could detect loss of effective pedal travel. I quit the measurement run /check about 5 miles from the end and only a mile from my house. I went home and checked the fluids and all that was OK but with now there was only about 1 inch of effective clutch pedal/travel. I nursed the car about 3 miles to my local repair shop. His quick look says probably it's the slave cylinder. Car is left behind, they take me home. Part is ordered and I'm back in the car next day at about 1 PM. (Yes - just a routine car experience, but related to rally as I was working on the March Lamb.) Dave

or....how did we end up here?

Greetings everyone! We made it back in one piece. From where, you ask? Here's a little hint:



Yes, folks, the Delaware contingent of the Schroy clan went to India! My wife's baby brother decided to get married to a lovely India-born, America-raised woman, and her family wanted to do a traditional wedding. Across the world, no less!

We left on July 28th from JFK on a 13 hour flight for Dubai, then on to a 4 hour flight to Delhi, arriving there July 30th. We ended up $9\frac{1}{2}$ hours ahead!

After a day trip to see the Taj Mahal – I'll bring pictures to the next meeting – we jumped on a plane Tuesday for the second leg of the trip. We flew into Chennai, which is a city twice the size of Baltimore, with a population 3 times the size of Baltimore, 1.6 million people. We took a drive from Chennai to Naidupeta, which really gave us a sense of how the traffic laws work-or lack thereof!



Cars and motorcycles everywhere! Everyone blowing their horns, but not in anger. They were using their horns more than using their turn signals. The lines on the road? More general guidelines, really. For example, on a 2-lane highway, if you caught up to a car or truck in front of you, you tapped your horn to let them know you were going to pass them as a courtesy, instead of surprising them and blowing by. Taxis were usually overflowing, even buses had people riding on the roof. It was a common sight to see more than one person on a motorcycle; at one point we saw a whole family of 5 on a motorcycle – Dad driving, toddler on the gas tank, 2 more kids behind Dad, and Mom riding side saddle at the rear. No bull\$#!%

Even seeing the architecture was amazing. Every building was concrete and brick. Some houses were mud and thatched roofs, but nothing was really built out of lumber. A number of roadside stands were concrete vendors with piles of sand and stone and such. You told the owner how much you needed and where. He would deliver, usually using ox carts. It was your job to get it mixed and poured on site. Even all the fenceposts we saw were cut out of granite. There really wasn't much of a lumber commodity, even though there was a sawmill in Naidupeta that we could hear from time to time.

The town we stayed in for the rest of our trip was a nice, quiet place. We didn't hear sirens the whole time we were there. We found out from the bride's family that we were the first group of Americans to visit the town. That explained why everyone made an effort to come by the house and look at us.

The bride's family made us feel right at home. The wedding was amazing to be a part of and watch. I took over 2,000 pictures of the whole trip, and my pictures will be in the official wedding album. Autocross III Report

The weather cooperated with us for the August autocross. While it did get pretty hot, (especially while waiting in the car) it stayed dry. The weather also seemed to please the geese, who left many gifts for us on the course. Many thanks to our sweeping crew, who moved the gifts off the course. Otherwise, mud + snow tires may have been required!

Duke designed an oval-shaped course this time rather than the previous figure 8 pattern. The return leg from the far end of the course was very quick, so you can see the times were quicker than last time. We had a moderate turnout, which let us all get in 6 official runs.

This was an unusual event since it was the first time since I've been running them that a Caterham 7 was not in attendance. Both Paul and George downgraded to Porsches for this event. They both complained that they were no longer able to reach out of the car and reset any cones they knocked down before anyone could notice. George and Dave Redmond shared a Boxster in B stock. With so much experience in one car, it scared everyone else out of the class and they had B stock to themselves. While George adapted quickly to the car, he couldn't make up for the experience of the older owner of the car. When asked how he did, George replied "the old guy beat me!" It was a similar story in BSP with Paul and I sharing my Cayman S. Paul was nice enough to not beat me in my own car, although with his times dropping each run I think it may have happened if we had done a couple more runs.
