After a brief meeting, course workers will head out to their assignments and drivers will meet their navigators. Precisely at 2:01PM, the first car will be sent on their way. Second car will be off at 2:02 PM. You'll spend about 1-1/2 to 2 hours navigating the hills of Chester County, Pa, Cecil County, MD, and New Castle County, DE and then end up back at Landis Lodge on Newport Gap Pike, which is now the headquarters for the DAB!

Picnic and Awards! After you find your way back to Landis Lodge, we'll have plenty of refreshment, food and prizes. Each participant gets a T-shirt generously donated by Porsche of Delaware. or.....6 Wheels? Really?

Okay, this month has produced the strangest one yet. It's another iteration of a bad Jeep donor vehicle, but the Jeepvette from a couple months ago was interesting to meeven with a bad execution. This month's vehicle was actually built by Mosler Automotive - Consulier GTP creator and one time presidential contender - and thank god, this one is a one-off...

This creation actually has an official name, instead of me coming up with something witty. It's called the J-10 Sport, with DNA from a Jeep CJ and a Chevrolet S-10 Pickup - the only one of it's kind produced by Mosler. The front half of the vehicle resembles a CJ, except for the double front axle, and the rear is an S-10 bed and drive axle. No word if it's a true 6x6...

But anyways, Warren Mosler himself is quoted on the Jalopnik website stating the purpose of this vehicle is "Smooth ride over rough roads and no roll/shake." Now, I admit I'm not the smartest bear in the forest, but why does adding a second set of turning wheels up front accomplish that? Apparently, both sets of wheels up front **DO** turn in parallel, much like the **Tyrrell P34**, the famous 6-wheel F1 car sponsored by Elf in 1976.



I always loved the P34, even had a large scale Matchbox type toy car when I was a kid. The P34 actually had a real purpose - the 6-wheel design reduced the lift caused by the traditional two large front wheels.

The tiny 10 inch diameter wheels improved the downforce on the front wing, and provided a larger tire contact patch and better cooling for the brakes. The two car P34 team actually came in first and second in the 1976 Swedish Grand Prix!

Okay, back to the J-10. The side view shows Jeep doors and convertible top, with a shortened truck bed and standard S-10 tailgate, plus a flat front tire - the middle one. The top doesn't look like it fits well, and from the side profile shot it looks like the rear of the CJ is at the bottom of the convertible top. The bed reminds me of the Explorer Sport Trac - a truck bed so short they left off the K.

The frame of the S-10 is still underneath, with no mention of where the extra front axle came from. It does have it's own fenders, so I am assuming it's from the donor CJ, along with the front clip, second front fenders, and hood.

Yikes. Did I actually type "second front fenders?" What is this world coming to?

Anyways, the front picture does show some rust on the supports/upper control arms, and with the flat middle tire, it doesn't look like this frankenmobile has gone anywhere for a while. It's in the Caribbean, owned by Warren Mosler himself still, and he plans on fixing the flat tire. Drive on, Mr. Mosler, drive on.

On a side note, I want to thank the members who have given me a couple suggestions for my articles. They will remain anonymous, to spare them any embarrassment or bruised egos. One of them was for a local car, for sale on Craigslist in New Castle. The posting was deleted before I finished this article, but it was a 1975 Chevrolet Caprice convertible with custom black and yellow paint, exhaust and interior. The bonus feature was the **30 INCH RIMS**, painted to match the car. No mention of any engine work, but this car fit the perfect definition of a **Donk**. There are a few colorful definitions on <u>www.urbandictionary.com</u>, if you're really interested. They are more twisted than I am.....
