Unfortunately, Brett had to leave early for another commitment. Paul Alderman then chaired a short meeting,


Grant Banning gave a brief update on German Car Day at the Millville track. It rained and there was a poor turnout.

The Hard Drive Garage – By Mark Schroy

or....here's your next grocery getter?!?

Holy cow. Words fail me for this one-almost...

Not your typical grocery getter or people mover. Thankfully, as advertised on Craigslist, it's a ONE OF A KIND!!! Well, no \$#!%. I never would have guessed...



The Craigslist ad is listed as a "1985 PLYMOUTH VOGAGER PRO STREET - \$12". Now, to me, when I see \$12, I immediately think "Hey cool, 12 bucks for a new ride plus some beers...", not 12 THOUSAND-wait, 12,500 later in the ad- for something that looks almost as bad as the El Cede from a little while ago...

The El Cede was a mix of Chevy muscle and Merc-Benz/Ferrari styling, where this strange brew has Plymouth ugliness and Chevy muscle, with a splash of Ford in the rear. These two builds have nothing in common, apart from the ugly yellow color and someone's odd sense of humor-oh, and the mixing of auto manufacturers that should NEVER happen.

This one originally was a 1985 Plymouth Voyager panel van-I think. Obviously, not anymore. It appears to have the original side bodywork, roof and rear tailgate, plus the rear bumper. Note the paint job on the rear bumper, plus the GIANT rear view mirrors and the front aero nose held on by speed clips.



The vehicle no longer has the transverse mounted engine, nor the front wheel drive setup. Within the custom hood and front end, the SBC is a stroked out 355 CHEVY MOTOR TURBO 400!!! mated to a TRANS 3500 CONVERTER!! with a 9 INCH FORD REAR END!!! and 456 GEARS!!!

His caps lock-not mine; my caps lock key also turns off. Either the seller has a stuck key on his keyboard, he yells all the time, or (Spinal Tap reference) he goes to ELEVEN...



This monstrosity only has seating for 2 willing-or kidnapped-people. The cargo area is greatly reduced by the scratch-built round section tube frame and huge tubs for the rear wheels, with the batteries bolted behind for weight distribution.



The custom dash doesn't look all that bad, really, but why bother to put in an aftermarket audio unit? Something tells me you won't hear much of it anyway.

Something else that bothers me about this build is how it's listed. Pro Street. Now, that is an actual NHRA class. I'm not a huge fan of drag racing, but I know that Pro Street means you can drive it during the week and race it whenever. This also means you better have a good radar detector or lots of bail money. If this seller is asking almost 13k for this thing, chances are he needs money for court fees-or he needs to buy his sanity back.

Lucky for us-or maybe not-this thing is located in New Hampshire. May it rust away in the land of crunchy granola.....
