Since making a major purchase of our timing equipment for our Autocrosses, we have now paid back the money used to buy the equipment. Our membership has increased to 90, only 10 people shy of breaking 100 members.

Rally Report (George Alderman) – Dave Mitchell is working on the Fall Rally, details to follow in future meetings.

Autocross Report (Duke Wilford) – Our 4th AutoX of the year was held at Glasgow High School, our attendance was down slightly (summer months?). This was our last AutoX to be held at Glasgow this year. Our next event finds us returning to Keene Elementary on 8/16/14. We have no Autocrosses scheduled for September due to the many car events scheduled that month. We will be staging the last AutoX of the year at Dover Downs on October 11th, with the rain date for the following week (Sunday,10/19). In conjunction with that, we agreed that anyone who signs up for new membership after 10/1, their membership would be good for the full following year. So if they join in October they will save \$5 on each AutoX in 2015.


Our Club Store is now set up and can be found on our website

Autocross Chair - Duke Wilford



For Autocross V, we returned to our roots at Keene Elementary. Although we had a minor recurrence of the Goose Poop Olympics from last year, forewarned was forearmed, and a number of people turned up early with broom in hand to help clear the courseway. Thanks to everybody who

pitched in to clear the track – especially to Frank Adkins, who couldn't attend the actual autocross, but turned up early to help clean and set up. We also enjoyed continuing good weather – let's hope the string of nice event days holds out for Autocross VI in October. Only 29½ car/driver combinations showed up. I was the ½ driver, as Nuri Heckrotte kindly let me drive his MR-S in the afternoon heat in addition to my own car. We were able to get a total of 6 competition runs in, with a handful of folks staying after for fun runs.

The course was a variation on the usual Keene "3 laps around the peanut" layout. It was very straightforward except for a series of esses on the uphill side that increased in amplitude, catching a few folks out, and making the ride interesting for most.

C Street and F Street (4 cars each) were the largest stock classes, though FS was plagued by mechanical issues. Mark Richmond's 300ZX threw a fan belt and retired after the morning heat. Mark – your floor mats are in the trailer! You should be able to get them at the next event, or stop by the Aldermans' shop to pick them up. In his first afternoon run, Bruce Thorngate unfortunately got a little too far out of the GM legal team's comfort zone, and his green Camaro popped the side curtain airbags and went into limp-home mode. Fortunately, Bruce didn't seem to have suffered any injury from the deployment, and the dashboard bags remained intact. We hope that isn't too costly to repair, Bruce. CS saw husband-and-wife first-timers Tom and Rebecca Saville sharing their Genesis coupe, Matt Stavros returning for a half day in his black 350Z, and Alex Meramo taking the win in his FR-S.

First-timer Sang Yi in his Evo X, veteran John Allard in his Cooper S, and Lou Spinelli in the mighty Cobra all ran unopposed, but seemed to have fun anyway. My intent is to start publishing PAX scores so that even 1-driver classes can compare their performance to the field.

A dozen ST entries took the flag, evenly split between STR and STU/STX. In fact, half the entries in STR were Nuri's MR-S! That little beast was shared by 3 drivers, and took the workout like a champ. Nick Gurnas and Robert Clifton shared Nick's bronze STR Mazdaspeed Miata.

Veteran autocrosser (but new face with BMC) Andre Downey showed up in his pretty red and gold bugeye WRX and took the win in STX, while first-timer Eddie Commatser brought his Mazdaspeed 3. Nuri and Gerry also shared Nuri's recently-purchased black S14 240SX, last seen in the hands of Jase Johnston. When the dust and flying cones cleared, Gerry Caceres held onto the overall FTD and STR win with his 2nd run in the MR-S.

Street Modified also turned up with plenty of entries – 6 in all. Walt Jones's SSM Sonoma was sporting fatter tires up front and fatter swaybars all round. Don McVicker and John Renna shared John's beautiful blue FD RX-7, taking 1st and 2nd in SSM. SM was all GC-era Subaru Imprezas – albeit in a variety of drive configurations! Bryan DiSanto's clean AWD 2.5RS, Kevin Turner's FWD rally car, and Travis Whiteside's RWD hot rod all battled for position and wound up in that order.

With the return of the Cheese Head and our multi-lap format, a time in the 47s put you in the Top 10. David Hughes was on the 3rd step with a 45.402, and Nuri in the MR-S had 2nd overall with a 44.867. But 1 second is a big gap in autocross, and Gerry Caceres ran away with FTD at 43.802, also in the MR-S. That is one quick little monster.

Thanks to all of our event volunteers in tech, instruction, registration, and timing/scoring. Although we were a little shorthanded, the day ran smoothly. We are always looking for volunteers to handle the technical roles on a regular basis. If you are tired of chasing cones and might be interested in an assigned position, please contact me.

Don't forget, the autocross program is off during September, before we return to the Monster Mile in Dover for our season finale on 11 October. Please spread the word to all your car-type friends! This big venue offers a fast, fun, open course. Details and preregistration are available at BMC's usual locations, and at www.motorsportreg.com. We hope to see a lot of faces and a lot of cars there!
