Autocross Chair - Duke Wilford



BMC's third autocross was held on 14 September at Ripken Stadium. Because a makeup date had not been finalized, AxIII was our annual Lofland Memorial Cup event. The Cup is named in honor of Jack Lofland, a BMC member and sportscar

enthusiast from the '70s who passed away at an early age. The Cup is inscribed with the name of the driver posting the fastest raw time of the day at the Club's last regularlyscheduled event each year.

Preregistrations ramped up in the preceding week, and the event was well attended, with 85 drivers taking to the course. Non-members outnumbered members by about 2:1. Although it might not seem like it, weather was ideal, with light overcast skies, low winds, and temperatures in the low 80s.

The course was short and straightforward, with a mix of high- and low-speed sections. Knowing which was which was very important! Some parts of the course required patience to navigate cleanly. There were no slaloms, but a long, off-camber sweeper at the finish caught a number of drivers out, including yours truly on one disastrous run.

Competition was strong throughout the day. Defending Lofland champ **Ken Houseal** switched from 2017's SSM ringer car to C Street, limiting his chances at the raw time FTD. Ken gave it his best shot anyway, coming in 6th overall and 3rd in PAX.

Oddly enough, the Top Ten drivers all came from either Street or Street Modified, with no ST or SP cars making that list. Nine of the Top Ten drivers posted 34second runs – **Jason Simon** squeaked it in with a 34.999 in his STi and **Robert Myers**'s TT roadster was close behind at 35.429. BMC regulars **Ken Houseal**, **Elias Roman**, and **Carlton Griggs** rounded out the high 34s. Only 0.2 seconds separated the Top Five, which comprised two C5 Corvettes (**Alden Axford**'s Z51 and **Nathan Atkins**'s Z06) and two Porsches (**Richard Newman**'s aircooled 911 and **Michael Tavenner**'s Cayman S). The one thing that was not like the others in the Top Five was **William Cruz**'s Tesla 3 Performance, which could be seen (but barely heard) rocketing out of the start gate and up the hill. William Cruz in his D Street Tesla started out quick, and consistently whittled away the tenths pass after pass, ending the day with a **34.371** on his last run. Richard Newman and his green SSM 911 gusted around the mid-34s all day. Richard unfortunately coned on his last run, putting his smoking 34.249 out of contention and leaving him to stand on his 5th run with a **34.340**. Alden Axford, Sr. started in the high 34s and his times actually climbed slightly during the day. Alden dug deep on his last run and drove his yellow Vette to a clean **34.310**, just 0.030" ahead of 2nd place and 0.061" over 3rd.

So, hearty congratulations to BMC member and regular Alden Axford, Sr, our 2019 Lofland Memorial Cup champion! Full results and points standings are available at the Club's website.

Since we will have 4 events this season, our **2019 Driver Of The Year** champion will be determined by each driver's 3 best scores, with their lowest showing dropped. Lofland Driver Of The Year is the top PAXindexed driver of the season, and competition is stiff here too. Current points are determined based on the 3 completed events, with no drops. AxIV could shake the standings up a little. The final winner will also have their name inscribed on the newly-rediscovered Lofland PAX cup, which has not been awarded in at least 10 years.

Turnout has been good, and we were able to secure a makeup date from Ripken Stadium management. We will make up out cancelled autocross event on Saturday, 12 October. Thanks to everybody who came out for AxIII and let me know that hosting another event would be popular. Preregistration for Autocross IV is open at http://msreg.com/BMCAxIV2019 and will close Thursday, 10 October, at 6:00p.

Thanks for everyone's support and participation so far in 2019. Lets bring the season to a strong close in October.



BMC Rally II - Rally To The Valley October 19, 2019

A Tour Rally to Valley Forge National Park

The rally route is set on fun / twisty roads in northern Delaware and southeastern Pennsylvania. The course is approximately 60 miles long and will take about 2 to 2-1/2 hours to complete. All roads are paved although some may be bumpy in places.

Start Location: Greenville Center, Wilmington, Delaware, 19807 - intersection of Kennett Pike (Rt 52) and Buck Road. Meet at the "Greenville Center" sign for check-in.

On-site Check-in: 11:30a - PLEASE NOTE MORNING START

First Car Off: 12:00p + Car Number thereafter

<u>Finish Location:</u> The rally ends at Wayne's Woods Picnic Area in the Valley Forge National Park. BMC has reserved a picnic area with a nice view of the Washington Memorial Arch.

BMC will provide the grills, charcoal, and some hot dogs/hamburgers, and drinks. If you want to bring something else to grill, you can and we will grill it. However, we ask that you please bring a picnicky side to share. You may also want to bring lawn chairs

BMC will also provide some lawn games, but feel free to bring your own. .

BMC has a sizeable canopy in case of light rain. If weather is poor, there is a tentative backup plan to eat at Infinito's Pizza in Phoenixville.

Classes: *Tour*: This rally is a Tour format with no TSD requirements, just clues and questions. Drive the rally route at your leisure and enjoy the scenic roads.

Cost: BMC members: \$10 per car / Non-members: \$15 per car

- Vehicles must pass safety and technical inspection.
- No loose or unsecured items in any area. Remove floor mats from cabin.
- All cars are welcome to compete except SUVs and other vehicles that present a rollover risk.

• Common Solo rules and classifications will generally be followed. We reserve the right to modify/ interpret these rules to suit the spirit of the competition and to promote safety. Please take time to research what class your car will be in prior to registration.
